Mary enjoyed sewing and using her artistic abilities to enrich her family's lives. She owned several small businesses over the years including Maw-Maw's Flea Market, Link's upholstery, Long Branch Saloon, Beer Mug and co-owned Link's Trailer Park. But her world was her family. She was at every ball game, pageant and event she could attend helping to get grandchildren from one end of the parish to another and cheering them on the whole way. There was never anyone as "great" as her babies and she wouldn't mind telling you so. Mary was an active member of the DeRidder Al-Anon for many years.
