Funeral services for Bobbie Lee Myers Harris, 82, of DeRidder, Louisiana, will be held at 5 P.M., Sunday, July 25, 2010, at the First United Methodist Church in DeRidder with Rev. Jon Tellefero officiating. Burial will follow in Beauregard Cemetery in DeRidder under the direction of Labby Memorial Funeral Home in DeRidder. Mrs. Harris passed away Thursday, July 22, 2010, in her residence.
