He served as pastor at Good Hope Baptist, Arkadelphia Baptist and Texas Avenue Baptist Churches along with being involved in ministering to those in nursing homes. The Lord also called him to serve as a missionary to Honduras. Billy organized Beulahland Ministries which he ran for 19 years, organizing and growing churches, and ministering to the spiritual, physical and educational needs of the people of several Honduran communities. He was recognized by the Honduran government for his efforts to improve the lives of the people of Honduras. Billy loved his work in Honduras and felt the people of Honduras were like an extended second family. You could not talk to him for five minutes without him bringing up something about the country and the people he met.
