William owned and operated Carroll Brothers Erection Company in Irving, TX for many years. He also was a member of the National Hot Rod Association racing team Carroll Brothers "Texas Whip". Bones as he was known set seven different World records in Speed/ET during his racing career. In 1984 he was inducted into the Division 4 NHRA Hall of Fame.

After he retired he and his mother Vesta moved to Hornbeck. He was a member of the Prewitt's Chapel Baptist Church in Hornbeck. He loved to hunt and fish and he loved "Story Telling"
