Joseph Hall Toler, Jr, 69, of DeRidder, Louisiana, passed away on 21 January 2024.

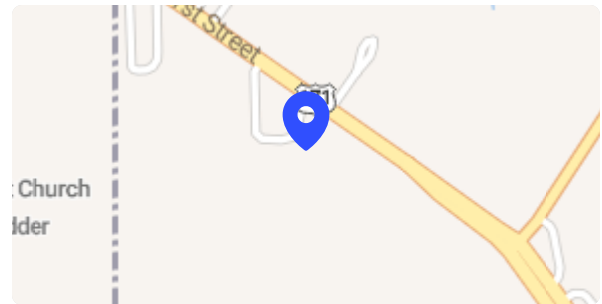
